Around 1906 the EP&NE Railroad designated Mosquero as a water stop, and with the railroad came land-hungry immigrants. Benjamin Brown, a lawyer and real estate agent, organized the Mosquero Land Company, named for nearby Mosquero Creek, and began selling tracts. In July 1908 he laid out a town site and filed the plat at the courthouse, and in September he constructed a hotel near the siding. Mr. Brown and his wife donated the land for Mosquero, as the new town was called, which became the largest settlement in Harding County.
